Notes for Contributors

To submit an article to the Luso-Brazilian Review, please visit our manuscript submissions website at <https://lbr.msubmit.net>. All manuscripts must be between 5,000 and 8,000 words (not including notes and bibliography) and written in ENGLISH or PORTUGUESE. Authors who are not writing in their native tongue should have their manuscript edited for style and grammar by a qualified specialist before submission. Submission of a manuscript will be understood as an avowal that it presents original work not under consideration elsewhere. Only one manuscript per author can be under peer review at a time. All manuscripts must be in Times New Roman font, number 12 with standard margins and double-spaced and should include a short abstract in the opposite language of the text. Do not include keywords. Only blind manuscripts will be accepted for peer review. Any reference to the author's previous work must be written in the third person. Please visit our website for a complete set of submission guidelines.

All book reviews are solicited by the editors and should be submitted in electronic format to lusobraz@mailplus.wisc.edu. The length of book reviews is typically 750–1250 words; reviews must include both the author's name and the full citation of the book being reviewed. Unsolicited reviews are considered only with the prior approval of the editors.
